

What to Expect During Your Installation

Flooring installation day is exciting - and Hadinger Flooring is here to make the process smooth, from start to finish. Here's what you can expect during your installation, so everything stays on track and stress-free.

Carpet

- **Existing floors** will be removed and disposed of (if arranged)
- **Carpet and padding** are laid, installed, and stretched for a secure, wrinkle-free fit
- **Seams** will be placed as discreetly as possible
- **Edges** are trimmed and tucked neatly under baseboards or into transition strips

Hardwood

- **Planks** are installed, leaving enough space for natural expansion.
- **Moldings** are added along the edges to cover expansion gaps and give your floor a finished look
- **Variations in color and grain** should be expected; every hardwood plank is unique.

Luxury Vinyl & Laminate

- **Planks** are laid and locked together for a tight, secure fit
- **Trim**, baseboards, or quarter-rounds are added to cover edges and create a finished look
- **Transition pieces** are installed where your new floor meets other surfaces
- **For glue-down applications**, a final pass with a weighted roller helps ensure a secure, long-lasting bond

Tile

- **Layout** is carefully planned for a balanced, professional look
- **Tiles** are set using mortar and spacers for consistent alignment
- **Cutting and fitting** are completed neatly around edges and corners
- **Grout** is applied and cleaned to complete the installation



SUBFLOOR AWARENESS

All subfloors are inspected prior to installation. Conditions like moisture, uneven areas, or damage may require additional preparation to ensure long-term performance.



What to Expect in Your Home

- Despite efforts to contain it, dust and noise are part of the process, especially when cutting and sanding. Fine dust may travel to nearby areas, so covering electronics and delicate items in adjacent rooms is recommended.
- Minor scuffing to baseboards or walls may occur during installation as materials are moved and fitted.
- New floors may have a mild scent at first. This is normal, and will fade as the space settles.
- Some furniture may be temporarily relocated during installation (if arranged).
- Access to certain areas may be limited during installation and briefly after
- Depending on the project, installation may take place over one or more days



Finishing Touches

- Final trim, moldings, and transitions give your new floor a polished, seamless look.
- Basic cleanup is performed at the end of the job.
- Before leaving, the installer will inspect the space with you to ensure it meets your expectations.
